## About This Brochure

This brochure features the common service facilities, trade depots and display centers built for women microentrepreneurs in local sites of the GREAT Women Project. These facilities are intended for consolidation, production, upgrading and marketing women's products.

This brochure provides a directory of enterprise desks in GREAT Women Project sites that can assist women entrepreneurs with services and resources for their businesses.

It informs prospective women microentrepreneurs how to contact their respective local government units to access these common service facilities and enterprise desks.

## About The GREAT Women Project

The Gender Responsive Economic Actions for the Transformation of Women (GREAT Women) Project is a governance and capacity development project that aims to promote and support a gender-responsive enabling environment for women's economic empowerment, particularly those in microenterprises.

The Philippine Commission on Women (PCW), the national machinery for gender equality and women's empowerment, is the executing agency for the Project. The PCW forged partnership with key national government agencies involved in micro-, small- and medium-scale enterprise (MSME) development and select local government units to create a gender-responsive enabling environment for women's economic empowerment. This project (spanning from 2006-2013) is provided with technical and financial support by the Government of Canada through its Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development (DFATD), formerly the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA).

Women's economic empowerment (WEE) refers to women having access to and control over high-value productive resources, such as information, credit, loans or financial assistance, services, training, markets and technology. With women's economic empowerment, women have decent jobs and humane working conditions, while enjoying benefits from wealth-creating opportunities equal with men.
