

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The Statistical Handbook on Violence against Women and Children is a publication prepared by the SOCIAL SECTORS DIVISION of the STATISTICAL PROGRAMS AND RESOURCE MANAGEMENT OFFICE, NATIONAL STATISTICAL COORDINATION BOARD. 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The NSIC is a one-stop shop of statistical information and services in the Philippines.

This Statistical Handbook on Violence against Women and Children was developed to provide hard statistics on the prevalence of violence against women and children. It consists of two parts: (1) Violence against Women; and (2) Violence against Children.

One of the major activities of the Project on the Development of a Methodology to Generate Statistics on Violence against Women and Children (VAWC) is the compilation of available statistics on VAWC. The statistics presented in this publication are based only on the information from administrative in-take forms used by various government and non-government agencies in handling cases of VAWC. Hence, the statistics presented covers only reported cases of violence against women and children.

Cases reported in one agency, say the PNP, may have also been served and counted by the DSWD. Thus, statistics for each agency cannot be added across agencies. The absence of data on the unreported cases should be taken in the interpretation and formulation of conclusions of statistics presented in this handbook. Nevertheless, this handbook provides a valuable insight on the recent trends and patterns of the VAWC problem in the Philippines.

This statistical handbook on VAWC was made possible through the data support of the following agencies: Philippine National Police (PNP), Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Department of Labor and Employment-Bureau of Women and Young Workers (DOLE-BWYW), Commission on Human Rights-Child Rights Center (CHR-CRC), and Women's Crisis Center (WCC). We wish to acknowledge the continued invaluable support they extended to us and likewise encourage other government and non-government agencies to join us in our efforts to improve gender statistics in the Philippines.

As one of the outputs of the Project on the Development of a Methodology to Generate Statistics on Violence against Women and Children, this Handbook will be useful to the government, private, and non-government organizations in establishing a baseline from which projections could be made to improve the present situation of Filipino women and children. We wish to acknowledge with appreciation the Canadian International Development Agency Institutional Strengthening Project Phase II (CIDA-ISP II), whose

cooperation and valuable assistance extended to us made the publication of this Handbook possible. The VAWC Project is the second component of the NSCB-NCRFW Project on the Improvement of Statistics on Gender Issues with funding support from the CIDA-ISP II.

Cases of violence against women and children are being reported and served in various government and non-government agencies. Each of these agencies has their respective administrative forms designed to suit the information they want from their victim or clientele. From these, summary reports are prepared by these agencies for dissemination to the public and private sector.

As users of this handbook, certain issues should be followed on the interpretation of the statistics presented. Important points of this handbook are as follows:

- Statistics presented covers only reported cases of violence against women and children, thus, statistics for each agency cannot be added across agencies (i.e., cases reported in one agency, say the PNP, may have also been served and counted by the DSWD);
- ii. Classification of the case may vary across agencies (i.e. a case classified in PNP may be classified by the DSWD differently);
- iii. It is possible that an agency may record a reported case as one, corresponding to two victims (i.e., a rape case may have been committed against two sisters).

Although faced with certain restrictions and considerations, this handbook provides a valuable insight on the recent trends and patterns of the VAWC problem in the Philippines.

Figure 1. Top Three VAW Cases Reported to the PNP, 1998-1999



Figure 2. Distribution of VAW Cases Reported to the PNP by Place of Commission, 1998-1999 (In Percent)





Figure 4. Distribution of VAW Cases Reported to the PNP by Status of the Case, 1998-1999 (In Percent)



(In Percent)



Figure 6. Distribution of VAW Cases Reported to the PNP by Day of Commission, 1999 (In Percent)









Figure 10. Distribution of VAW Victims Reported to the PNP by Age Group, 1998-1999 (In Percent)



Figure 11. Distribution of VAW Victims Reported to the PNP by Relation to Perpetrator, 1998-1999 (In Percent)



Figure 12. Distribution of VAW Perpetrators Reported to the PNP by Age Group, 1999 (In Percent)





Figure 14. Distribution of VAW Perpetrators Reported to the PNP by History of Substance Abuse, 1999 (In Percent)



Figure 15. Top Three Child Abuse Cases Reported to the PNP, 1998-1999



Figure 16. Distribution of Child Abuse Cases Reported to the PNP by Place of Commission, 1999 (In Percent)



(In Percent)



Figure 18. Distribution of Child Abuse Cases Reported to the PNP by Status of the Case, 1998-1999 (In Percent)



(In Percent)



(In Percent)



Figure 21. Distribution of Child Abuse Cases Reported to the PNP by Time of Commission, 1999 (In Percent)







Figure 24. Distribution of Child Abuse Victims Reported to the Police by Age Group, 1999 (In Percent)



Figure 25. Distribution of Child Victims Reported to the PNP by Sex, 1999





Figure 27. Distribution of Perpetrators of Child Abuse Cases Reported to the PNP by Sex, 1999 (In Percent)



Figure 28. Distribution of Perpetrators of Child Abuse Cases Reported to the PNP by History of Substance Abuse, 1999 (In Percent)


