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PREFACE

It is practically impossible to do any effective planning without the right kind of information. Thus countless statistical material continues to be produced, mainly for use in planning at the national and regional levels. Until recently, however, statisticians tended to publish data only in aggregates particularly at the subnational level.

There are several reasons for this. One is that it is extremely expensive to produce data at several levels of disaggregation, so that even while raw data are available in the computer files, the decision to process the data can be constrained by tight budgets and to some extent, schedules. But perhaps a more important reason is that sex-based data has not been regarded as critical to planning and policy-making, be it at local or national levels. Statistical producers themselves do not fully appreciate the need to disaggregate data by sex and other variables. The assumption is that there is no need to distinguish between women and men whether as agents or beneficiaries of development, since development programs are intended for all and therefore should affect the sexes in much the same manner.

This assumption is now being challenged. As various studies have shown and as pointed out by gender equality advocates, women have needs and situations different from those of men because of biological and social factors and that in many cases, blindness to gender considerations have resulted in women being sidestepped by development. Therefore, programs to address the needs of both should be designed and implemented within a gender-responsive framework. Sex-based data would be the necessary tools with which to formulate gender-sensitive policies and programs, for they more concretely surface the various dimensions of inequalities by gender, class, geographic location and urban/rural settings.

The National Commission on the Role of Filipino Women (NCRFW), as the lead agency in advocating for gender equality and in assisting government agencies to integrate gender concerns in their respective development programs, has been relatively successful in influencing statistical decision-makers as to the importance of sex-based data. Through a series of collaborative activities, increasingly more sex-based data are coming out not only from primary producers like the National Statistics Office (NSO) but also from the administratively generated data of service-providing agencies like the education and health departments.

This publication is one of the outputs of the NCRFW project, funded by the Asian Development Bank, to develop a computerized database on women. The project involves the special generation of data at various levels of disaggregation, as well as the institutionalization of sex-disaggregation in data collection and generation activities.

The sets of data presented here focus on the employment configuration of women and men across regions -- an attempt, for the first time, to provide information on the extent, if any, of variations brought about by topographical, cultural and other environmental and socio-economic factors that impinge on the behavior of the labor market.

At the least, therefore, this publication is expected to fill in some of the identified information gaps. It is envisioned to be particularly helpful in mainstreaming gender at the regional level where, already, some government offices have begun to review seriously their development plans and programs in order to give equal consideration to women's and men's needs.

INTRODUCTION

The years in review: 1991-1994

The year 1991 is remembered for the eruption of Mt. Pinatubo in Central Luzon which spewed out millions of tons of lahar in at least three provinces and left thousands of erstwhile rich agricultural land practically barren and in danger of desertification. Hundreds of thousands of people were displaced, some permanently and others intermittently as the rainy seasons triggered sporadic explosions and lahar flows in the affected areas. Jobs and livelihood sources disappeared as farms and factories were obliterated by the dreadful flow, forcing many to leave the area and to rebuild their lives on safer grounds.

While other parts of the country were spared from ruinous mudflows, some regions were visited by equally devastating natural calamities. In Region 8, a deadly typhoon left thousands dead while in Northern Luzon, lives and livelihood were destroyed by typhoons even as people had yet to recover from the aftermath of the strong earthquake that shook the region the year before. During the same year, Mindanao suffered from a long dry spell, which reduced hydroelectric power generation drastically, adversely affecting the region's business sector. Metro Manila also suffered from a power crisis that slowed or shut down many businesses resulting in considerable loss to production and income. Economists assessed the country's economy at rock bottom by the third quarter of the year.

The term of the Ramos administration approached midpoint in 1994. After winning the presidency in 1992, Mr. Ramos vowed to bring the country to NICHOO -- Newly Industrialized

Country status -- by the year 2000 through a package of comprehensive and integrated socio-economic programs. His first two years were focused on putting the Philippines back on its feet after the ravages of the previous year's calamities, as well as in instituting reforms to fuel the economy for the years ahead. As early as this period, there were already signs of a resurging economy as the GNP at constant 1985 prices rose from P720.3B in 1991 to P795.0B in 1994, with an inflation rate that improved dramatically from a double digit figure of 18.6 percent in 1991 to 9.1 percent in 1994.

Data source and coverage

The following data sets were specially generated by the NSO from the 1991 and 1994 October rounds of the Integrated Survey of Households. Included are tables on labor force participation, employment, marital status and household headship as well as occupational and industrial characteristics. Due to certain technical considerations, there are no data on income in this compilation. Finally, in the absence of parallel data on overseas contract workers (OCWs) for 1991 and 1994, a small table on the region of origin of OCWs, by sex and year (1992-1993) was included to complement the information on domestic employment.

To provide the reader a reference in the classification of provinces by region, the numerical and descriptive regional aggragation of the country, and the provinces included therein, is listed below. References to the regions in the text will be by their numerical label.

NCR (National Capital Region) - cities of Manila, Pasay, Quezon, Caloocan, Makati, Pasig, Mandaluyong and Muntinlupa; municipalities of Malabon, Marikina, Taguig, Las Pinas, Paranaque, San Juan del Monte, Valenzuela, Pateros, Navotas

CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region) - Abra, Benguet, Ifugao, Kalinga-Apayao, Mt. Province

Region I (Ilocos Region) - Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan

Region II (Cagayan Valley) - Cagayan, Isabela, Nueva Viscaya, Batanes, Quirino

Region III (Central Luzon) - Bataan, Bulacan, Pampanga, Nueva Ecija, Tarlac, Zambales

Region IV (Southern Tagalog Region) - Aurora, Batangas, Cavite, Laguna, Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Palawan, Quezon, Rizal and Romblon

Region V (Bicol Region) - Albay, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, Masbate and Sorsogon

Region VI (Western Visayas) - Aklan, Antique, Capiz, Guimaras, Iloilo, Negros Occidental

Region VII (Central Visayas) - Bohol, Cebu, Negros Oriental, Siquijor

Region VIII (Eastern Visayas) - Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Eastern Samar, Northern Samar, Western Samar

Region IX (Western Mindanao) - Basilan, Zamboanga del Norte, Zamboanga del Sur

Region X (Northern Mindanao) - Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Bukidnon, Camiguin, Misamis Occidental, Misamis Oriental, Surigao del Norte

Region XI (Southern Mindanao) - Davao del Norte, Davao del Sur, Davao Oriental, Sarangani, South Cotabato, Surigao del Sur

Region XII (Central Mindanao) - Lanao del Norte, North Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat, Marawi City and Cotabato City.

ARMM (Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao) - Lanao del Sur except Marawi City, Maguindanao except Cotabato City, Sulu, Tawi-Tawi

Scope of analysis

Bearing in mind that these statistical tables are intended more for regional planning and programming, there is no attempt to make a detailed analysis of the data across the different variables. Instead, the following text includes only the highlights of the data for both years, and significant differences among regions, if any. Readers are requested to examine the data further for the finer distinctions between regions, between urban and rural settings and between age and sex over the two year period, to meet specific requirements. The full tables at the beginning are included to enable users to recast tables or recompute rates based on certain desired variables or indicators.

OVERVIEW

Labor force participation rates

The size of the labor force grew from 25.246M in 1991 to 27.483M in 1994 or an addition of 2.237M new entrants into the labor market. However, the labor force participation rate (LFPR), or the proportion of the population aged 15 and above, whether male or female, who were employed or unemployed remained relatively steady at the 64 percent level. This means that there were 13.868M persons in 1991 and 15.188M in 1994 who were considered not economically active, about three fourths of whom were women.

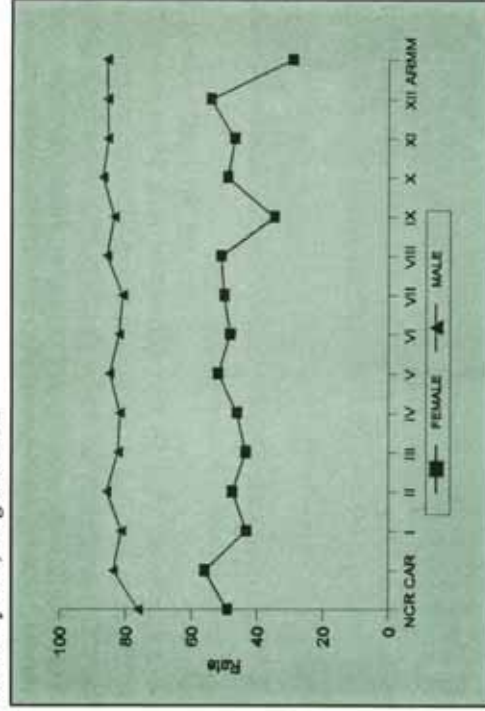
Due to women's reproductive responsibilities and to certain cultural norms that expect them to stay at home, the participation of women in the labor force has always been lower than that of men. In 1991, male LFPR was estimated at 82.5 percent compared to the female's 47 percent or a difference of 35.5 percentage points.

Rural males had higher LFPRs than their urban counterparts (86.3 vs. 78.5%) due to the more difficult economic conditions in rural areas, driving more members of the family out into the work arena. It appears that whether in urban or rural areas, women had about the same propensity to participate in the labor market (46.7 vs. 47.4%).

In general, regional rates do not differ significantly from each other, except for the observable lower level LFPR for females in the ARMM which was registered at 29.2 percent, 17 percentage points lower than the national average for females in 1991, while the male rate for this region appeared as among the highest. It is not certain if this has a cultural explanation in the sense that Muslim women may opt to stay at home as full-time

homemakers or if their religion encourages less exposure to the outside world.

The highest participation rate for females was in the CAR where more than half (55.9%) of the women aged 15 and over were labor force members, followed by Region XII (54.1%), Region V (51.9%) and Region VIII (51%).

Employment rate

The rate of employment did not change significantly over the period as it hovered at the 91 percent level for the whole population. In absolute terms, this translates to more than two million jobless during the period, less than half of whom were women.

Rural areas had higher employment rates than urban centers (88.1 vs. 93.8%), probably due to the less informal arrangements and the lower level skill requirements of rural jobs as contrasted to urban centers where more formal structures govern employment activities and higher level skills are required for participation in economic activities. On the whole, females had slightly lower rates than males (89.5 vs. 91.9%), especially in the rural areas (90.8 vs. 95.4%).

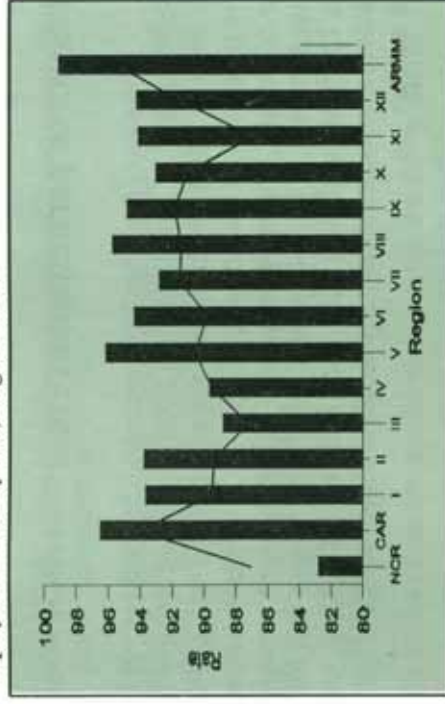
Urban women had a higher employment rate than urban men (88.3 vs. 87.9%).

The same pattern was observed in 1994 although there was a slight decrease in the gap between the employment rate of males and females in rural areas (92.2 vs. 95.8%).

Across age groups, both females and males exhibited comparable rates at ages 35-64. This means that their participation peaked at about the same time and with about the same magnitude. However, females tended to enter the labor market later than their male counterparts as shown in their lower rates in the age group 15-24 (average of 78.8% for females and 84.9% for males).

Across regions, ARMM consistently showed high rates for both males and females reaching 100 percent at age 35 and above. Meanwhile, unemployment rates higher than 10 percent were registered in the NCR and in Regions III and IV.

Marital status

As expected, majority of the workers were married; less than one third were single and the rest were either widowed or separated. Men tended to be more married than women (69.3 vs. 59.7% married), especially in urban areas (70.9 vs. 54.1%).

One interesting point about marital status is that it provides some indication of the incidence of single-income families by looking at the percentage of workers who were widowed or divorced/separated. For example, in 1991, 5.3 percent of the employed workers were either widowed or divorced/separated. Since they were once married, it could be inferred that majority or many of these would have children; and assuming that they were not living with extended families or their children were too young to be part of the labor force, it is possible that the burden of breadwinning in some households may be borne by one person.

The same 1991 data show that among the employed there are more women (843,000) than men (363,000) who were widowed/divorced/separated. This situation was evident throughout the country regardless of region and area and in both years covered by the data.

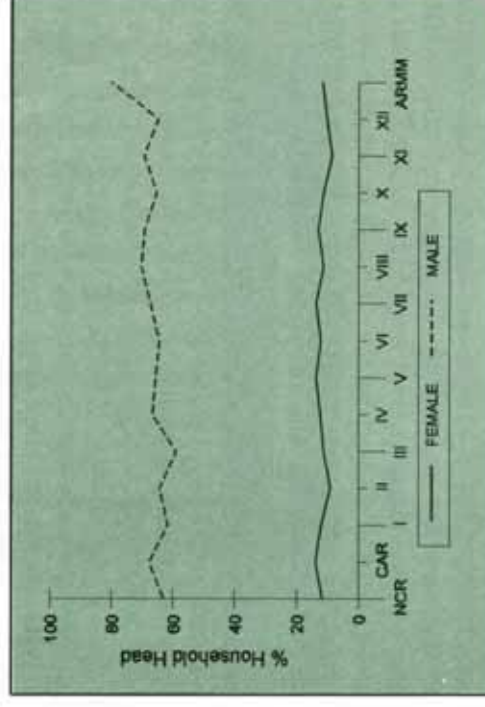
Household headship

Household headship provides some insights on the economic burden of workers. Very high incidence of household headship among employed persons may translate into a higher economic pressure on workers because of the dependence of household members for support. Lower incidence rates on the other hand may indicate that a worker's income is an augmentation to an already existing one for a household, in which case the economic pressure may not be as heavy. But a lower incidence of household headship could also be an indication of economic status of households since it could mean that more members need to earn to meet the needs of the household, or that the value of household income is decreasing relative to its purchasing power.

Data show that less than half (46.2%) of the workers were household heads during the period. Female household heads accounted for only 11.8 percent of all female workers or 9 percent of all workers who were household heads. Among male workers, two thirds (65.8%) were heading households. There was a very slightly higher incidence of household headship among female workers in urban areas than in rural areas (12.3 vs. 11.3%), owing to the more conservative view of the role of women and men in rural settings.

Across regions, areas where household headship among women was higher than the national average was found in the CAR (13.9%), Region V (13.8%) and Region VII (13.7%). The others were in Regions IX, VI, IV and I. Lowest incidence was found in Region XI (8.6%) and Region II (9%). In urban areas, highest rates were registered in ARMM (16.3%), and in Regions I and V (both at 15.7%).

The pattern of household headship revealed in 1991 did not vary for female workers in 1994. Slight variations were found for male workers although these minor changes did not alter the trend observed in 1991.

Educational attainment

Median educational attainment of all employed persons in 1991 was some secondary or high school education. In general, females had higher educational qualification than males as shown in the higher percentage of these workers who have college education (25.21% vs. 16.23%). The serious disparity in educational opportunities and facilities between urban and rural areas is reflected in the significant difference in the educational attainment, i.e. the percentage who have reached college or tertiary education, between urban and rural workers. As expected, urban workers are more educated than rural workers but the discrepancy between urban and rural female workers is greater (35.24% vs. 14.45%) than the difference between urban and rural males (25.81% vs. 8.5%). This situation may be attributed to the tendency of better educated workers to flock to urban areas where they expect to land better jobs commensurate to their qualifications. Also, more women with higher educational attainment tend to migrate to urban areas compared to men.

Across regions, NCR has the highest proportion of college-educated workers for both females and males at an average of 39 percent for both sexes. Understandably, the best and most number of colleges and universities in Metro Manila attract college students from all over the country who, after graduation tend to stay in search of employment in the metropolis. Coming far second were Region II (21.49%) and Region IV (19.78%). Lowest percentages of college-educated workers were registered in Region VIII (11.43%) and ARMM (13.01%).

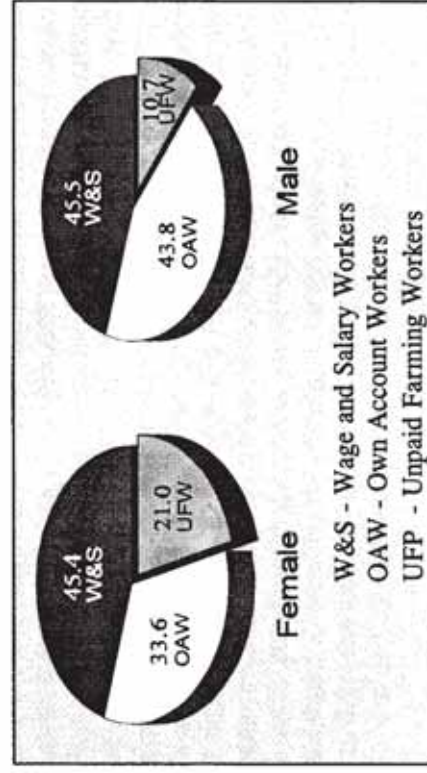
In rural parts of Regions V, VI, VII, VIII and IX, more than 60 percent of workers have only elementary education.

Meanwhile, in majority of the regions, one fourth to one third of workers reached high school.

Class of worker

Majority of workers in 1991 were waged and salaried (45.4%) particularly those in urban areas (59.4%). However, there seemed to be a higher entrepreneurship level in rural areas as shown by the higher percentage of own-account workers (46.8%), particularly for males (52.1%). In urban areas, more than half (58.2%) of the female workers were waged and salaried; in rural areas, slightly more than a third (36.2%) were own-account workers. Data show a similar pattern in the distribution of male workers in urban and rural areas.

Class of Worker: 1994



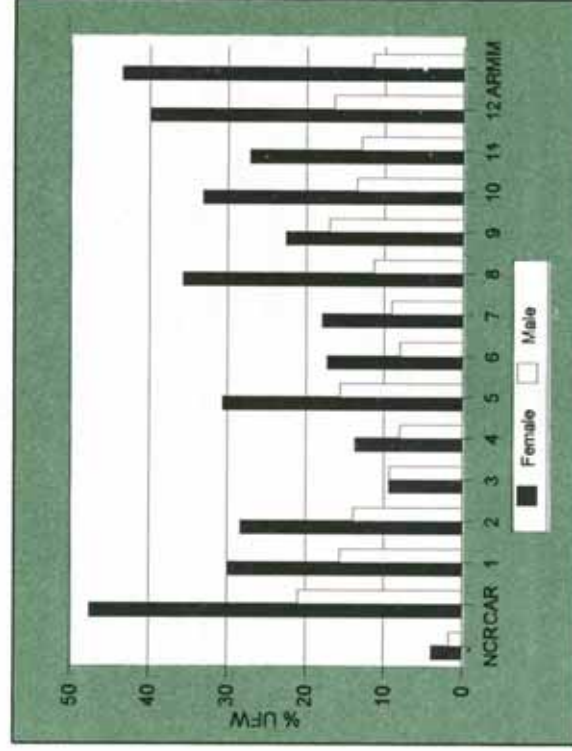
Across regions, the highest proportion of wage and salary workers, both female and male was registered in the NCR at 75.3 percent, understandably due to the concentration of business establishments in the metropolis and the continuing influx of wage seekers from all parts of the country. Coming a far second were regions closest to Metro Manila - Region III (55.7%) and Region IV (52.9%). The lowest proportion of wage and salary workers was found in ARMM where only one tenth of the workers in this area were of this category. This is not surprising since this region registered the highest percentage (70.4%) of own-account workers, followed by Region VIII with 49.3 percent of its workers. NCR came out with the lowest percentage of own-account workers, although, in absolute numbers, this figure would still be very large due to the heavy population in this area.

Greater urban female entrepreneurship was also found in Region I where close to one half (46.5%), and in Region IX where 42.9 percent, of the women were counted as self-employed.

One important note about this table is the proportion of workers who are considered unpaid family workers. These workers live in the same household and are usually family members or relatives who help in family enterprises, including farm work, but are not paid for their labour. Much more of female labour is classified as unpaid, and this hides their actual economic contribution to household income.

Data show that whether in urban or rural setting, the proportion of female unpaid family workers was higher than that of

males. In rural areas, the comparative figures were 14.4 percent for males and 32.1 percent for females. In urban centers, the figures were 6.2 and 10.7 percent respectively. Figures in 1994 exhibited a similar pattern.

Among urban women workers, ARMM reported the most number of unpaid family workers at more than two thirds of the total (41.9%) while in rural areas, unpaid women family workers were a majority in CAR (60%) and more than 40 percent in Regions I, VIII, X, XII and ARMM.

Number of hours worked per week

Males and females worked about the same number of hours per week. Wage and salary work entailed the most number of work hours at 45.9 per week while unpaid family work consumed only 32.8 hours or an average of 5.5 hours a day in a 6-day work week. Workers in urban areas devoted more hours in their jobs than those in rural areas, whether it was wage and salary, own account or unpaid family work. Female workers in urban areas spent more time in their work than did urban male workers; however, male workers worked longer hours than their female counterparts in rural areas.

Sales and service work demanded the most time with more than 50 hours a week spent on these jobs.

Occupational characteristics

The predominant occupation of the population in 1991 was still agriculture where close to one half (44.7%) of the workers were employed. The most highly agricultural areas during this year were ARMM (78.8%), Region XII (65.1%) and CAR (61.3%). Except for NCR, Regions III, IV and VII where the proportion of agricultural workers fell below 50 percent, the rest of the regions were still largely dependent on agricultural production for livelihood. Next to agriculture, the other main occupations were production (21.3%) and sales work (13.5%).

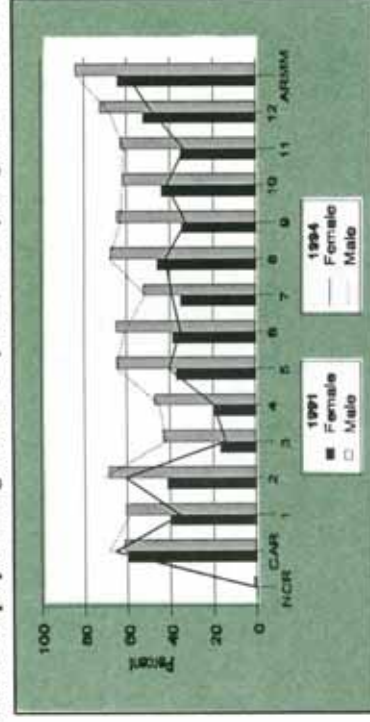
Male workers were more likely to be in agriculture (53.1%) and in production work (26.3%) as they comprised more than three fourths of the work force in these two types of

occupation. The rest were scattered in small numbers in the other occupation groups.

The occupational distribution of females was more diverse. During the period, they were found to engage in agriculture (29.9%), sales (25.6%), service (14.5%) and production work (12.6%). A good proportion belonged to the professional group (10.2%).

Regions where more than 50 percent of the females worked in agricultural production were in CAR (59.8%), Region XII (52.4%) and ARMM (64.2%). Next to agriculture, sales was the most common occupation of the women in these and in all other areas.

NCR and Region II had the same proportion of professional female workers and the highest among the regions at 14 percent. Service occupations were most common in NCR

where more than one quarter of all female workers belonged to this category. Following in lesser proportions for this type of occupation were Region III (18%), Regions II and VI (15%) and Region XI (14.8%). Female production workers were also in significant number in Region IV (21.6%), even greater than NCR's 18.5 percent. Region IV's large proportion of production workers resulted from the proliferation of industrial estates which attract female workers in this area, particularly the CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon) provinces.

Comparing the 1991 and 1994 data shows some shifts in the concentration of workers, particularly females. In many instances, the proportion of female agricultural workers slightly went down, such as in Regions I, VI, VIII, IX, X, XII and ARMM. Many of these workers shifted to service or sales. In others, (CAR, Regions II, V and VII), female agricultural workers increased, some of them moving from sales, production and service occupations.

Industry groupings

Agriculture remained the dominant employer in the Philippines with close to one half of all workers and more than half of male workers alone working in this area. The most highly agricultural regions in 1991 were ARMM with close to 80 percent of workers in agricultural production, Region XII (64.8%) and CAR (61%). Outside of Metro Manila, the least proportion of workers in agriculture was found in Region III (34.9%) and Region IV (37.7%).

Female agricultural workers comprised the majority in ARMM, CAR and Region XII. The least number were in Regions III and IV.

As their occupational pattern similarly shows, women workers had a more diverse industrial affiliation than men. Aside from agriculture, a substantial number of female workers were engaged in wholesale and retail trade, service industries and manufacturing activities. Male workers were concentrated in agriculture (53.9%) and to a much lesser extent in the service industries (12.3%), after which they comprised small numbers in manufacturing, transport, construction and wholesale and retail trades.

Across regions, NCR registered the biggest percentage of female in community, social and personal service industry (42.3%) followed by Regions II and III (33%). On the other hand, the largest group of female workers in manufacturing industries were found in Region IV, consistent with the Region's and NCR's significant percentage of production workers. Major industries in these areas were in garment, textile and leather. Wholesale and retail was a key industry in most of the regions except in ARMM where majority worked in agriculture and only one tenth of the female workers engaged in this industry.

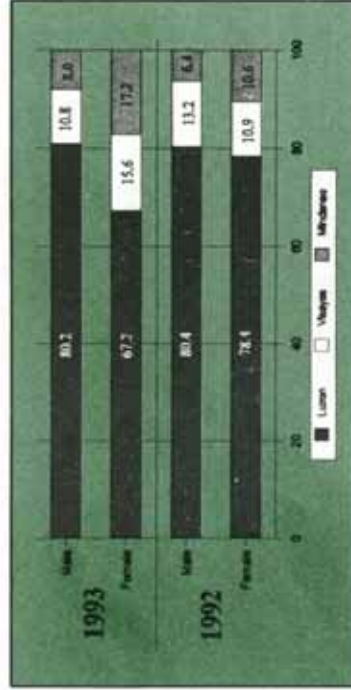
Overseas contract workers

In 1992, there were a total of 755,551 overseas contract workers (OCWs) coming from all parts of the country. Of this

number, 40 percent were women. After one year, the number rose to 852,935 or a net increase of close to 100,000 workers, most of them coming from NCR, Region IV and III. Women contributed about 45 percent to the increase. From Luzon originated about 80 percent of the workers, 12 percent from the Visayas and the rest from Mindanao.

For women OCWs, the top sending regions were Regions I, IV, NCR, III and II whereas for the men, NCR, Region IV and III were the chief source of OCWs. In the Visayas, Region VI was the biggest sender and for Mindanao, it was Region XI, for either male or female workers. In 1993, the same regions remained the leading source of OCWs for both women and men.
